Safety Precautions

This equipment has been designed and manufactured to meet international safety standards but, like any electrical equipment, care must be taken to obtain the best results and for safety to be assured.

Please read the points below for your own safety. They are of a general nature, intended to help with all electronic consumer products and some points may not apply to the goods you have just purchased.

Air Circulation

Leave more than 10cm around all edges when wall mounting the television to allow adequate ventilation. This will prevent overheating and possible damage to the television. Dusty places should also be avoided.

Heat Damage

Damage may occur if the television is left in direct sunlight or near a heater. Avoid places subject to extremely high temperatures or humidity. Place in a location where the temperature remains between 5°C (41°F) min. and 35°C (94°F) max.

Mains Supply

The mains supply required for this equipment is 220-240V AC 50/60Hz. Never connect to a DC supply or any other power source. DO ensure that the television is not standing on the mains lead.

DO NOT cut off the mains plug from this equipment, this incorporates a special Radio Interference Filter, the removal of which will impair its performance. In the UK, the fuse fitted in this plug is approved by ASTA or BSI to BS1362.

It should only be replaced by a correctly rated and approved type and the fuse cover must be refitted.

IF IN DOUBT, PLEASE CONSULT A COMPETENT ELECTRICIAN.

Do

DO read the operating instructions before you attempt to use the equipment.

DO ensure that all electrical connections (including the mains plug, extension leads and inter-connections between pieces of equipment) are properly made and in accordance with the manufacturers' instructions. Switch off and withdraw the mains plug before making or changing connections.

DO consult your dealer if you are ever in doubt about the installation, operation or safety of your equipment.

DO be careful with glass panels on equipment.

WARNING: To prevent injury, this apparatus must be securely attached to a solid base in accordance with the installation instructions.

- DO NOT REMOVE ANY FIXED COVERS AS THIS WILL EXPOSE DANGEROUS AND 'LIVE' PARTS.
- THE MAINS PLUG IS USED AS A DISCONNECTING DEVICE AND THEREFORE SHOULD BE READILY OPERABLE.

Do Not

DO NOT obstruct the ventilation openings of the equipment with items such as newspapers, tablecloths, curtains, etc. Overheating will cause damage and shorten the life of the equipment.

DO NOT allow electrical equipment to be exposed to dripping or splashing or objects filled with liquids, such as vases, to be placed on the equipment.

DO NOT place hot objects or naked flame sources, such as lighted candles or nightlights on, or close to equipment. High temperatures can melt plastic and lead to fires.



WARNING: To prevent the spread of fire, keep candles or other open flames away from this product at all times.

DO NOT use makeshift stands and NEVER fix legs with wood screws. To ensure complete safety, always fit the manufacturers' approved stand, bracket or legs with the fixings provided according to the instructions.

DO NOT leave equipment switched on when it is unattended, unless it is specifically stated that it is designed for unattended operation or has a standby mode. Switch off by withdrawing the plug, make sure your family know how to do this.

Special arrangements may need to be made for people with disabilities.

DO NOT continue to operate the equipment if you are in any doubt about it working normally, or it is damaged in any way – switch off, withdraw the mains plug and consult your dealer.

WARNING – excessive sound pressure from earphones or headphones can cause hearing loss.

ABOVE ALL – NEVER let anyone, especially children, push or hit the screen, push anything into holes, slots or any other openings in the case.

NEVER guess or take chances with electrical equipment of any kind – it is better to be safe than sorry.

Installation and Important Information

Where to install

Locate the television away from direct sunlight and strong lights, soft, indirect lighting is recommended for comfortable viewing. Use curtains or blinds to prevent direct sunlight falling on the screen.

Place the TV set on a stable, level surface that can support the weight of the TV.

The LCD display panels are manufactured using an extremely high level of precision technology, however sometimes some parts of the screen may be missing picture elements or have luminous spots. This is not a sign of a malfunction.

Make sure the television is located in a position where it cannot be pushed or hit by objects, as pressure will break or damage the screen, and that small items cannot be inserted into slots or openings in the case.



Avoid using chemicals (such as air refreshers, cleaning agents, etc.) on or near the TV pedestal. Studies indicate that plastics may weaken and crack over time from the combination effects of chemical agents and mechanical stress (such as weight of TV). Failure to follow these instructions could result in serious injury and/or permanent damaged to TV and TV pedestal.

Cleaning the screen and cabinet...

Turn off the power, and clean the screen and cabinet with a soft, dry cloth. We recommend that you do not use any proprietary polishes or solvents on the screen or cabinet as this may cause damage.

When using a Wall Bracket


Please use a wall bracket appropriate for the size and weight of the LCD TV.

- Two people are required for installation.
- · To install a wall-mount from another manufacturer.
- 1. Unplug and remove any cables and/or other connections from the rear of the TV.
- 2. Carefully lay the front of the unit face down on a flat, cushioned surface such as a quilt or blanket.
- 3. Follow the instructions provided with your wall bracket. Before proceeding, make sure the appropriate bracket(s) are attached to the wall and the back of the TV as described in the instructions provided with the wall bracket.
- 4. Always use the screws supplied or recommended by the wall mount manufacturer.

Removing the Pedestal Stand:

- 1. Carefully lay the front of the unit face down on a flat, cushioned surface with the stand hanging over the edge.
- 2. Remove the screws.
- 3. After the screws are removed, hold the pedestal stand in place, then remove it from the TV by sliding away from the bottom of the TV.

NOTE: Extreme care should always be used when removing the pedestal stand to avoid damage to the LCD panel.





Inserting batteries and effective range of the remote



Remove the back cover to reveal the battery compartment and make sure the batteries are inserted the right way round. Suitable battery types for this remote are AAA, 1.5V.


Do not combine a used, old battery with a new one or mixed battery types. Remove exhausted batteries immediately to prevent acid from leaking into the battery compartment. Dispose of them in accordance with instructions on page 56 of this manual.

Warning: batteries must not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunlight or fire.

The performance of the remote control will deteriorate beyond a distance of five metres or outside an angle of 30 degrees from the centre of the television. If the operating range becomes reduced the batteries may need replacing.

Connecting External Equipment

Before connecting any external equipment, turn off all main power switches. If there is no switch remove the mains plug from the wall socket.



Aerial cables: -----

Connect the aerial to the ANT socket on the rear of the television.

If you use a decoder and/or media recorder, connect through the decoder and/or media recorder to the television.

SCART cables: -----/

Connect the video recorder **IN/OUT** or decoder **TV** socket to the television. Connect the media player **SAT** socket to the decoder **MEDIA REC**. socket.

Before running **Auto Tuning** put your decoder and media recorder to **Standby**.

HDMI® (High-Definition Multimedia Interface) is for use with a DVD, decoder or electrical equipment with digital audio and video output. It is designed for best performance with 1080i high-definition video signals but will also accept and display 480i, 480p, 576i, 576p, 720p and 1080p. HDMI1 also support VGA, SVGA, XGA, WXGA and SXGA.

NOTE: Although this television is able to connect to HDMI equipment it is possible that some equipment may not operate correctly.

A wide variety of external equipment can be connected to the back of the television, therefore the relevant owner's manuals for all additional equipment must be referred to.

If the television automatically switches over to monitor external equipment, return to normal television by pressing the desired channel button. To recall external equipment, press to select.



HDMI CEC Connections

The basic functions of connected audio/video equipment can be controlled using the television's remote control if an HDMI CEC compatible device is connected.



Connecting an HDMI or DVI Device to the HDMI Input

The HDMI input on your television receives digital audio and uncompressed digital video from an HDMI source device or uncompressed digital video from a DVI (Digital Visual Interface) source device.

This input is designed to accept HDCP (High-Bandwidth Digital-Content Protection) programme material in digital form from EIA/CEA-861-D-compliant [1] consumer electronic devices (such as a set-top box or DVD player with HDMI or DVI output). For acceptable video signal formats, see page 13.


NOTE:

- Some early HDMI equipment may not work properly with your latest HDMI TV, due to the adoption of a new standard.
- Supported Audio format: Linear PCM and Dolby Digital, sampling rate 32/44.1/48kHz.

To connect an HDMI device

Connect an HDMI cable (type A connector) from the device to the HDMI terminal. For proper operation, it is recommended that you use an HDMI cable with the HDMI Logo (HDMI®).

- If your HDMI connection is capable of 1080p and/or your television is capable of refresh rates greater than 50Hz, you will need a Category 2 cable. Conventional HDMI/DVI cable may not work properly with this mode.
- HDMI cable transfers both video and audio. Separate analogue audio cables are not required (see illustration).




To view the HDMI device video, press the ⊕ button to select HDMI 1 or HDMI 2 mode.

To connect a DVI device

Connect an HDMI-to-DVI adapter cable (HDMI type A connector) to the HDMI 1.

- The maximum recommended HDMI DVI cable length is 6.6ft (2m).
- An HDMI-to-DVI adapter cable transfers video only.
- · Separate analogue audio connection is not supported for audio receivers.



To ensure that the HDMI or DVI device is reset properly, it is recommended that you follow these procedures:

- · When turning on your electronic components, turn on the television first, and then the HDMI or DVI device.
- When turning off your electronic components, turn off the HDMI or DVI device first, and then the television.

[1] EIA/CEA-861-D compliance covers the transmission of uncompressed digital video with high-bandwidth digital content protection, which is being standardized for reception of high-definition video signals. Because this is an evolving technology, it is possible that some devices may not operate properly with the television. 
Connecting a Computer

With either an RGB/PC or an HDMI connection, you can watch your computer's display on the television.

To connect a PC to the HDMI terminal

When connecting a PC to the HDMI terminal on the television, use an HDMI-to-DVI cable.

If connecting a PC with an HDMI terminal, use an HDMI cable (type A connector). A separate analogue cable is not necessary.



For acceptable PC and video signal formats, see page 13.

NOTE:

- · The edges of the images may be hidden.
- If connecting a certain PC model with a unique PC signal, the PC signal may not be detected correctly.



Using the Controls

While all the necessary adjustments and controls for the television are made using the remote control, the buttons on the television may be used to control some functions.



Switching On

If the RED standby LED is unlit, check that the plug is connected to the power supply. If the picture does not appear press 1 on the remote control, it may take a few moments.

To put the television into standby, press 1 on the remote control. To switch on the television, press 1 again. The picture may take a few seconds to appear.

For energy saving:

We recommend that you use the television with factory settings. These settings are designed for energy saving. Unplugging the mains plug will reduce energy use to zero. This is recommended when the television is not being used for long periods, e.g. when on holiday. Reducing the brightness of the screen will reduce energy use. Energy efficiency reduces energy consumption and can save money by reducing electricity bills.

NOTE: Putting the television into standby mode will reduce energy consumption, but will still draw some power.

Using the Remote Control

To set up the television, you will now need to use the on screen menus. Press **MENU** on the remote control to see the menus.

The on-screen menu appears as a list of six topics. As each symbol is selected by pressing ◀ or ▶ on the navigation ring on the remote control.

Press ▲ or ▼ on the navigation ring to move up and down through the menu and use or to select the required choice. The functions of each menu are described in detail throughout this manual.

Using the Controls on the TV

Press - 4 to adjust volume.

Press \odot to display programme information.

Press → and hold until Source List is displayed, then press - ∠ + to scroll through the list until desired input source is located.

Please always refer to the owner's manual of the equipment to be connected for full details.

NOTE: Inserting the headphone plug will mute the sound from all speakers.

Tuning the Television

Before switching on the television, put your decoder and media recorder to standby if they are connected. To set up the television, use the buttons on the remote control as explained on page 7.

First Time Installation

1. Plug in your television for using it for the first time

The Language menu will appear.



- 2. Press ▲, ▼, ◀ or ▶ to select your language.

 Press ல to enter Country menu.
- **3.** Press **△**, **▼**, **◄** or **▶** to select **Country** then press **⊙** to enter **Time Zone** page.




Press ▲ or ▼ to select Time Zone then press
 to enter Tuner Mode page.



Press ▲ or ▼ to select Mainland or Canary Islands(for Spain) / Mainland or Azores Islands(for Portugal).

NOTE: This function is only available when Country is Spain and Portugal.

5. Press **△** or **▼** to select **Antenna** or **Cable**.




Press ok to enter Location.

NOTE: This function is only available in certain regions.

6. Press **◄** or **▶** to select **Home** or **Store**. For normal home use, select **Home**.




For Store use, confirmation message will pop up.




Press ◀ or ▶ to select **YES** or **No** then press Ok to enter **Auto Tuning** page.

 Press ▲ or ▼ to select Tuning Mode and then press ◄ or ► to select DTV, ATV and DTV+ATV.

NOTE: Please make sure the aerial is connected to the TV before tuning.



Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Start** and press **OK** .



The search will begin for all available stations. The slide bar will move along the line as the search progresses.

You must allow the television to complete the search.

When the search is completed, the television will automatically select channel 1. This may not be a clear picture or the signal may be weak so the station order can be changed using **ATV/DTV Manual Tuning** in the **Installation** menu.





3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Start and press (or) to start Auto Tuning.

NOTE: When Parental Control is activated, the 4-digit password is needed.

Auto Tuning

The **Auto Tuning** function will completely re-tune the television and can be used to update the channel list.

NOTE: It is recommended that **Auto Tuning** runs periodically to ensure that all new services are added.

NOTE: All the current channels and settings, for example the locked channels, will be lost.







 Auto Tuning and press ⑥ .

Warning messages will appear first. Press ◀ or ► to select **YES** or **No**.



2. Press ◀ or ▶ to select DTV, ATV or DTV+ATV.



 Press ▲ or ▼ to select Operator Selection, and press ◀ or ► to select Others, Ziggo or UPC,...etc.

NOTE: Operator Selection can only be adjusted by different Country setting.

- **4.** Press ▲ or ▼ to select **Scan Type**, and press ◀ or ▶ to select **Full** or **Quick**.

Digital Subtitle Language or **Audio Language** allows a programme or film to be viewed with a choice of soundtrack language, provided they are currently being broadcasted.

- 2. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Subtitle Display and press ◀ or ► to select On or Off.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to select Subtitle Type and press
 or ► to select Normal or Hearing Impaired.
- 5. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Digital Subtitle Language, Digital Subtitle Language 2nd, Audio Language or Audio Language 2nd and press ◄ or ► to select your preferred language.

Common Interface

The Common Interface Slot, situated on the side of the television, enables the insertion of a CAM (Conditional Access Module) and card. These are purchased from a service provider and allow additional subscription broadcasts to be viewed. For information, see a service provider.

- 1. Insert the CAM and card into the Common Interface Slot, following the instructions provided with the CAM. A box will appear on the screen to confirm that the CAM has been inserted.
- **3.** Details of the CAM should now be available.

NOTE: The software updating of CI Plus CAM may be automatically executed. At this time, any Recording/Reminder pro-gramme timer will be cancelled.

Software Update (USB)

1. Insert a USB storage device with a firmware file.



DNR (Digital Noise Reduction) enables you to "soften" the screen representation of a weak signal to reduce the noise effect.

MPEG NR – Noise Reduction

When watching a DVD, the compression may cause some words or picture elements to become distorted or pixelated.

Using the **MPEG NR** feature reduces this effect by smoothing out the edges.

- In the Picture menu, press ▲ or ▼ to select MPEG NR.
- 2. Press (ok) to enter submenu
- 3. Press ▲ or ▼ to select Off, Low, Middle or High.

Black/White Level

This function increases the strength of dark areas of the picture, which improves picture definition.

- In the Picture menu, press ▲ or ▼ to select Black/White Level.
- 2. Press (ok) to enter submenu.
- Press ▲ or ▼ to adjust the level from Off, Low, Middle or High. The effect depends on the broadcast and is most noticeable on dark colours.

Film Mode

A film's picture runs 24 frames a second, whereas movie software such as DVD,etc., that you watch on your television at home runs at 30 (NTSC) or 25 (PAL) frames a second. To convert this signal to reproduce a smooth motion and picture quality, select the Film Mode.

- In the Picture menu, press ▲ or ▼ to select Film Mode.
- 2. Press (or) to enter the submenu.
- **3.** Press ▲ or ▼ to adjust **Off** or **On**.

PC Settings

Most of the picture controls and functions are available. However features not available will be greyed out.

- In the PC input mode, the Manual Setting is not displayed.
- 2. First press RC ⊕ than press ▲ or ▼ to select PC input mode than ok to enter the submenu.
- **3.** This function may not be available for some signal or if no signal is received.
- **4.** The optimum points of the clock phase and sampling clock adjustments may be incomprehensible according to the input signals.

Auto Adjust

Automatically adjust all PC functions by the PC resolution.

- The screen is disrupted momentarily when adjusting PC Settings. This is not a sign of malfunction.
- The default settings and adjustment ranges may vary depending on the input signal format.

Horizontal Pos. and Vertical Pos.

Connect the PC and ensure that a picture is showing on the television screen. The picture position may now be adjusted to suit personal preference.

Clock Phase

The Clock phase matches the PC signal with the LCD display.

Adjusting this can clear horizontal stripes and picture blur.

Sampling Clock

Adjusting the Sampling Clock alters the number of pulses per scan, this will clear vertical lines on the screen.

Reset

Use Reset to return all items to the original factory settings.

Below is a guide to the functions of the remote control text buttons.

(a) Displays the index/initial page:

Press (a) to access the index/initial page. The page displayed is dependant on the broadcaster.

? Reveals concealed text:

To discover the solutions on quiz and joke pages press the [?] button.

Holds a wanted page:

E Enlarges the text display size:

Press en once to enlarge the top half of the page, press again to enlarge the bottom half of the page. Press again to revert to normal size.

⑤ Selects a page while viewing a normal picture:

Enter the page number then press ②/EX, a normal picture will be displayed. The television will indicate when the page is present by displaying the page number at the top of the screen.

To display news flashes:

Select the news flash page for the chosen text service (see the index page of your text service).

By pressing ⊕/⊠, news flashes will be displayed as and when they are broadcast.

Press ⊕/≅ again to cancel the display.

How to change the page:

Press ▲ or ▼ to change the page.

Press ◀ or ▶ to change the sub page when a sub page is available.

The news flash page must be cancelled before changing channels.

Subtitles

If Subtitles are available for your current programme, pressing the **SUBTITLE** button will toggle Subtitles on or off.

Stereo and Bilingual Transmissions

If stereo or dual language broadcasts are transmitted, the word Stereo or Dual will appear on the screen each time channels are changed and are disappeared after a few seconds. If the broadcast is not in stereo the word Mono will appear.

Stereo: Press O I/I to select Stereo or Mono.

Bilingual: If a bilingual programme is offered, the word **DUAL** will display on screen. To change between languages, press ○ I/I to switch between **DUAL I, DUAL II** or **Mono**.



EPG

EPG (Electronic Programme Guide) supports view program schedule and set recording or reminder timers. You can set or cancel a timer for selected programme within the guide. When the TV is on and the timer activates, a dialogue box is shown informing you that the programme is going to start. When the TV is in standby mode and the timer activates, the TV will wake up with backlight off, speaker mute on, and change to the channel selected.

You must set the time correctly before using this function. All set timers are cleared when performing a new channel scan.



System Audio Control

Using the Speaker Preference feature allows the television's remote control to adjust the volume or mute the sound of the speakers connected to the television via an AV amplifier.

Ensure that the connected AV amplifier and **HDMI CEC** equipment are selected in the input source selection and that the **Initial Speaker Setting** is set to **Amplifier** in the **HDMI CEC Control Setup** menu.

NOTE: When the AV Amplifier is switched on, its input source changed or the volume adjusted, the sound will be output from the AV Amplifier's speakers even if TV speakers has been selected. Turn the television off then on again to output the sound from the TV's speakers.

The full function may not work and is dependent on the amplifier being used.

HDMI CEC Control Setup

This feature uses CEC (Consumer Electronics Control) technology, and allows the control of Toshiba **HDMI CEC** compatible equipment from the television's remote control.

NOTE: Not all Toshiba products currently support **HDMI CEC**.






USB HDD Record Function

This function can be used to record and play digital broadcast programmes (function is dependent on country selection). Read the precautions below before recording or viewing programmes using the USB HDD record function.

NOTE:

- In order to use this function, a USB HDD needs to be connected to the TV. Do not use USB Hub.
- After recording operation, time may take to a recording start.
- Recorded programmes saved on the USB HDD can only be viewed on this TV. They cannot be viewed when connected to another TV (including the same model of TV), a PC, or other device.
- You cannot watch other channel while recording one channel.
- If the recording time to the USB HDD is too short, no data may be saved.
- You cannot record video input signals on the USB HDD.
- Not all types of broadcast may be recordable.
- After programming the TV to record digital broadcasting, do not disconnect the power plug before recording starts.
- Should video or audio recording fail due to malfunction of the TV or poor reception, no compensation would be paid.
- If there is a power failure or the power plug is disconnected during programmed recording, recording will stop and will not resume when the power returns or the plug is reconnected.
- Do not disconnect the power plug when the indicator LED is lit.
- Any changes implemented by the broadcasting station may affect programme scheduling.
- Scheduling of multiple consecutive programmes may result in the beginning of each programme not being recorded.
- Accurate start / finish time for recording is reliant on broadcasters maintaining correct time stamp if this not the case the recording will fail.
- Some broadcasters can control whether a program can be recorded or how long you may be able to view it for after recording. The on screen message "Retention limit expired" means that the time limit for viewing the program has lapsed.
- Programmed recording cannot take place if the power plug is not connected.
- Disconnecting the power plug during recording may result in failure to save the recorded programme.
- Locked channels cannot be recorded, even if you might be watching a programme on a locked channel.

- USB HDD recording feature is not available in all countries.
- When the USB HDD is formatted, all the data stored on the HDD will be erased.



When you connect a USB HDD to the USB port on the TV, a prompt will appear.

NOTE: Not guaranteed to work with all USB HDD.





- As the displayed programme time is calculated from the actual recording information, it may not match the recording time on the USB HDD.

To check a schedule:

 Press ▲ or ▼ on the Programme Timers screen to check the schedule.

To edit a schedule:

1. Press ▲ or ▼ on the Programme Timers screen to select the title whose schedule you want to edit and press (□).

The **Programme Timers** screen will appear. Change the settings as required, following the same procedure as for setting the schedule.


To delete a schedule:






